Instructions to Candidates appearing for Re-Entrance Test, to be conducted by Haj Committee of India, Mumbai.

- 1 In all there will be 150 Questions, comprising of two Sections. Each Question is printed both in Hindi and English.
- 2 **Section A** contains 100 General Studies (GS) Questions, whereas **Section B** contains 50 CSAT Questions, based on Syllabus of UPSC Prelims Examination only.
- 3 You have to mark all your responses only on the separate Answer Sheet provided. Choose **ONLY ONE** response for each item.
- 4 All items (questions) carry 1 mark.
- 5 **Penalty for wrong answers:**

THERE WILL BE PENALTY FOR WRONG ANSWERS MARKED BY A CANDIDATE.

- (a) There are four alternatives for the answer to every question. For each question a wrong answer would be liable for a penalty of one-third of the marks assigned to that question.
- (b) If a candidate gives more than one answer, it will be treated as a wrong answer even if one of the given answers happen to be correct and there will be same penalty as above to that question.
- (c) If a question is left blank, i.e. no answer is given by the candidate; there will be no penalty for question.
