6 Eligibility Criteria.

- (a) Only those candidates who have already completed their Graduation and are eligible to apply for the Civil Services Examination-2027 can apply for the HHRCI, Haj House Entrance Test. Those who are pursuing any regular course from any Institution or employed in any organization would not be entitled for admission at HHRCI.
- (b) **Age Limit:**-The age of the candidate should not be less than **21** years and maximum age should not be more than **30** years for General candidates and **32** years for SCs/STs and OBCs as on 1st August 2026.
- 7 There are 100 seats available through the entrance test, 80% seats are reserved for Muslim minorities and 20% for other minorities including SC/ST and OBC candidates. Hostel accommodation is compulsory and will be provided to all the admitted students. The HHRCI reserves the right to reduce the intake if sufficiently deserving candidates are unavailable. Also, if a student gets admitted in HHRCI, Haj House but remains absent from the academy for more than a week (without any prior permission to the office), the HHRCI, Haj House reserves the right to forfeit his/her seat.

8 Selection process for XVI batch for the Academic Year 2026-27:

The written test will comprise General Studies (Paper-I and Paper-II – Objective Type) and Essay & General Studies (Paper-III - Subjective Type), based on the latest UPSC pattern.

- (a) **Paper –I (General Studies)** would consist of objective-type questions. There would be 50 questions, and total marks for this section would be 100 (50 x 2 = 100). The students may take the question paper with them. There will be **negative marking** as per the UPSC norm i.e. **one-third** of the marks will be deducted for a wrong answer.
- (b) **Paper-II (CSAT)** would consist of objective-type questions. There would be 40 questions, and total marks for this section would be 100 (40 x 2.5 = 100). The students may take the question paper with them. There will be **negative marking** as per the UPSC norm i.e. **one-third** of the marks will be deducted for a wrong answer.
- Note:** Paper-II (CSAT) is a qualifying paper and candidates must secure a minimum of **33%** marks in Paper-II for Paper-I to be evaluated. Final Merit List will be prepared on the basis of total marks obtained by candidates in Paper-I, Paper-III and Interview.
- (c) **Paper-III** would consist of **Essay & General Studies** (Subjective-Type). In the Essay section, candidates will be required to write one essay out of four given topics, in about 700-800 words, carrying 50 marks. In General Studies (Subjective-Type), there will be four questions, one each from General Studies I, General Studies II, General Studies III, and General Studies IV, carrying a total of 50 marks.
- (d) All three papers will be available in both **English** and **Hindi**. The test aims to assess candidates' general awareness, logical and critical thinking, reasoning ability, comprehension skills, and their capacity to express ideas in a clear, organized, and structured manner.
- (e) The total duration of the examination will be **four hours**.
- (f) Paper-III (Subjective-Type) copies of only top 700 students will be evaluated based on the **MCQ test marks (Paper-I)**.
- (g) The total marks of the Personality Test (Interview) would be **fifty (50)**. The interviews will be held offline only at **Mumbai and Delhi**. The list of the candidates who qualify for the Personality Test (Interview) will be uploaded in the website, with the date of interview.

- (h) In case of a tie, the higher marks in the interview would be taken as the basis of selection. If there is still a tie, the younger candidate (age-wise) will get the seat.
- (i) Classes and the Test Series (Prelims and Mains) are compulsory for all admitted students of HHRCI, Haj House. In case of absence from classes or the test series, or unsatisfactory performance in the tests, disciplinary action may be taken. HHRCI, Haj House reserves the right to forfeit the student's seat in such cases.
- (j) Selected candidates have to pay a **Security Deposit of Rs.15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand Only) (Refundable)** at the time of Admission. Once the Candidate is admitted in Haj House, he/she will not be allowed to leave before Preliminary Examination to be conducted during May, 2027, else his/her deposit will be forfeited.
- (k) Refund of Security Deposit will only be made after Preliminary Examination, 2027.
- (l) Mess Charges are payable towards catering, on a pro-rata basis.
- 9 The entrance test will be held simultaneously at **Twenty (20)** centers namely **Ahmedabad, Aligarh, Bengaluru, Chennai, Delhi, Jaipur, Guwahati, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Mumbai, Nagpur, Patna, Ranchi, Raipur, Srinagar, Jammu, Calicut, Lucknow, Prayagraj, and Bhopal.**

Offerings of HHRCI for the Academic year-2026-27

- The free coaching will include (a) sessions on General Studies and CSAT (b) Test series, answer evaluation, discussions and essay writing practice, will be part of the curriculum. The academy will also conduct mock interviews for those who qualify for the Civil Services Main Examination 2026.
